Monday Monday	Resource Management	 Message Let's stop calling waste 'waste' and start to see it as a resource. When you have used it once, think whether it can be used again, or if not what else could it be used for? If waste can't be reused it needs to be recycled. To make sure we recycle as much as possible, it is really important to follow the waste signage and only place those items listed into the recycle bins. New signs are being launched and low cost recycled bins are being distributed to delivery offices, in February. All old signs must be replaced with the new ones when available. SHEMS audits this year will report back on waste separation and use of new signs and bins.
Tuesday	Sustainable Travel	 Look at the bite-sized comms on sustainable travel Is everyone aware of the Cycle to Work scheme (if not, details are available on My Bundle+). This has benefits for your health and the environment. Consider changing your travel habits (the bite size comms can help guide you).
Wednesday	Natural Environment and helping to protect it	 Have you seen the bite-sized comms on Biodiversity? Are you doing anything to protect biodiversity on your site (e.g. bird boxes, garden areas)? If you want to improve biodiversity on your site, consider completing the biodiversity survey.

		•	Water pollution is a big problem – we can help reduce it by controlling spills and leaks on site. O There are spill kits on site. These are important for spills. Don't use these as rubbish bins. O Help us prevent environmental incidents, by avoiding storage of chemicals, oil, salt etc near to a drain. O Don't discharge anything, other than rain water down a surface water drain. If you don't know where it goes, ask. If you have a concern over an environmental issue on site, report it to your Line Manager. For major concerns, use the 'Speak Up' Internal whistle-blowing line. It is confidential.
