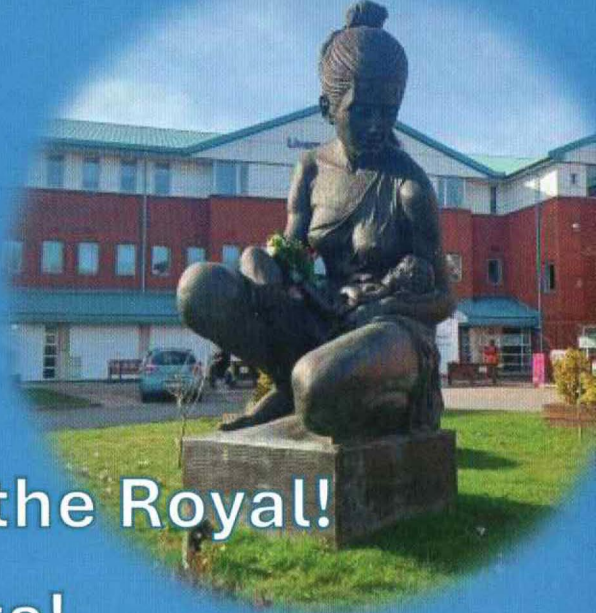

Spring 2026

Plans for Liverpool Women's Hospital were agreed at the ICB on January 29th, 2026. The proposals are to move Liverpool Women's Services to floor 9 of the already overcrowded Royal. Plans go to public consultation after the May Elections. Please get involved in this. The final decision would be made in Autumn 2026.

Floor 9 at the Royal is currently admin and meeting rooms. The proposals say, "*...there would be some compromises on standard room sizes (all single rooms are approximately 4sq.m. under sized) and there is no isolation provision on a typical ward*". This means less room for vital emergency equipment and staff.

We say "Save the Liverpool Women's Hospital. No closure. No privatisation. No cuts. No merger. Reorganise the funding structures not the hospital. Our babies and mothers our sick women deserve the very best". More than 84,000 people have signed this on our two petitions, online and in person.

We face a maternity crisis in the UK, with deaths and injuries worse than twenty years ago. Hospitals and NHS services are struggling under appalling financial cuts and never-ending winter crises.

The NHS England is withholding £133m of funding from Cheshire and Merseyside NHS across 2025-26. This is after huge cuts in their 25-26 budget in April. Our local hospitals and NHS services are suffering badly.

The women and babies of Liverpool are expected to sacrifice the Crown Street Site for rooms on floor 9 of an already overcrowded hospital. There is no expectation of a new hospital.

At the ICB meeting they said there would be “No stepping back from the long-term support for option 6” (moving everything into the Royal).

The public consultation will focus on Option 2, which would start with the most complex cases moving. Surely the most complex cases need the greatest care, so should have the high-quality accommodation, with room for teams to work around the patient and baby.

These mothers would not be on the same site as the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU). The plan includes some limited but welcome improvements at Liverpool Women’s Hospital on Crown Steet, while movement to the Royal goes on.
